Founded in 1977, Tri-Valley Haven is a vital community resource in the Tri-Valley area serving adults and children who have experienced domestic violence, sexual assault, or homelessness.

Tri-Valley Haven's domestic violence shelter, aptly named SHILOH, for peace, has been the only confidential emergency shelter in the area. In the past decade, Tri-Valley Haven has helped over 3,000 families in finding safe homes.

After many years of housing families, the current shelter is falling apart. Due to the effects of the recent pandemic, the need for shelter has increased thus requiring a larger intake capacity. By expanding capacity, this new shelter will help 50% more households, individuals, and children to flourish and attain self-sufficiency. Dedicated play areas for children, groups, therapy rooms will be added. 
